Dear delegates, ladies and gentlemen,

As every year I would like to present my Annual Report of 2018.

Before presenting this I would like to thank the responsible sports friends of the Slovakian Dobermann - Club Alica and Wolfgang Freyer, who organized this IDC - World Winner Show "40th Anniversary" in 2018 from September 8th to September 9th, 2018.

At this show about 450 entries were presented to four judges from three different countries, who judged them consistently over these 2 days.

Now to my annual report 2018

In this past year, there were 20 matings with males that are bred abroad. This resulted in 30 litters with 262 born puppies. This corresponds to an average litter size of 8.7 puppies per litter.

Also 22 Dobermans that are bred abroad were registered into the German studbook.

As I already mentioned in my annual report 2017, only HD- recordings which are digitally uploaded by the veterinarian into the Portal Myvetsxl.com can be evaluated. However, the inscription must still mention: "Dobermann-Verein e.V." The HD X-ray sheets with the data of the dog must still be sent to the breeding and working register.

The HD evaluator continues to be Dr. Silke Viefhues and the senior evaluator Prof. Dr. Meyer-Lindenberg from Munich.

I must also point out again that the HD evaluations must be paid before the evaluation at the DV office, otherwise no evaluation will take place.

It is also pleasing that the dogs presented for Körung did not show any eye diseases.

In 2018, 30 breeding tests were carried out in Germany and abroad.

Here the statistics of the ZTP's:

Furthermore, I would like to ask you that the admission time for the approval of a ZTP by the DV-breeding and working service must be respected!

Reason: all Dobermans coming from foreign breeding areas need to be checked to see if they can be admitted to a ZTP.

It was announced at the congress that the offspring, who would like to participate in a ZTP from 01.01.2020, have to prove that the parents have a ZTP.

I can inform you about the following results of the Willebrand examinations:
